#### **After School Clubs**

#### **Reading Books and Planners**



Please ensure your child brings their reading book and planner to school every day and is heard read at home. Children

will be heard read in school at least once a week and will only have their reading book changed once a week. The children are also using the school library on Wednesdays with our volunteer librarians, Claire Bibby and Miriam Kilroy.

#### Pump bags

PE kits need to be left in school for the whole half term as children will be doing at least three sessions of physical education a week and there may be opportunities for additional sessions. PE kits can be taken home to wash in the half term holidays.

PE is an essential part of the curriculum and it is vital that children participate in this lesson. Please note that the school does not hold a stock of kit for children who have not brought their own.

Reminder: Football kits are being worn for PE, would you please ensure that your child has the correct labelled PE kit which is black shorts, a white tshirt and plimsolls.

#### **Name Tags on School Uniform**

Please can you ensure that your child's name is attached or written into all of their uniform, coat and shoes, as we are having difficulty identifying which items belong to which children.

We are quite aware that uniform etc. cost a lot of money and how annoying it is when you are unable to locate your child's personal belongings.

#### **Change of Details**

Please inform the school office immediately if there are any changes to your address, telephone numbers etc. This is to ensure all your details are up to date if we need to contact you concerning your child.

#### Safeguarding - Absences and Lates

If your child is absent from school please telephone the School Office before



9.30am. You will receive a call enquiring where your child is if we have not been informed by this time.

- The school teaching day commences at 9am and children need to arrive for 8.50am prompt.
- Any pupil arriving late will have to be signed in by their parent explaining why they are late for school that day. This follows the Education Welfare Officers regulations for late attendance.
- Pupils who have an unexplained absence will receive a letter from school asking for details.
- You can now book to see a GP in Tameside at evenings and weekends.
- Medical appointments must be made after school hours where possible as these can have a significant effect on attendance
- If your child has to attend a pre-arranged medical appointment please send in the appointment card or letter to the School Office.
- The Education Welfare Service has asked schools to remind parents of the level of expected attendance. If your child's attendance falls below 95% we will inform you via a text message in the first instance. If attendance continues to fall, letters will follow and finally you will be invited to come into school to discuss your child's absence before further action is taken.
- All holidays during term time will not be authorised.
- If your child is absent for 5 days this equates to 10 sessions which could result in a fine.

#### **Whole School Attendance**

Our whole school attendance is currently 96.63%, although this is great news please ensure that holidays, medical appointments etc. are arranged during the school holidays attendance has a direct impact children's education.
