## Coronavirus update

#### Childcare:

You can use registered childcare providers and nannies, however friends/family who do not live with you cannot visit your home to help with childcare unless they are part of your support bubble. Children of parents who are separated are allowed to move between households.

When the term household is used, it is referring only to the people you with and any support bubble in place.

A support bubble is where a household with one adult joins with another household. Households within a bubble can still visit each other, stay overnight, and visit public places together.
