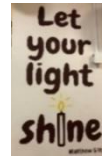

Instead of the annual Incredibly Crafty Christmas Market, BBMT is happy to provide an opportunity to shop in person with your local craftspeople and artists. We will be popping up for a couple of hours from outside our own homes and in an outdoor location outside the Community Centre. Please follow C-19 rules.

- At the top end of the village at 16 Home Farm Avenue, you can visit Clare with Moondot Fine Art & Illustration Here you can purchase original artwork, prints and handmade Christmas cards.
- At 14 Westend you can find Laura of Flaural Designs purveyor of beautiful Christmas wreaths and floral bouquets.
- At 106 Mottram Road, opposite the church, you will find Love Broadbottom with a selection of locally themed Hoodies, T shirts, bags, gift bags, wrap and tags. We are currently taking orders for printed to order garments. Looking forward to seeing you on the day... from a safe distance, of course!
- Next door at 108, Broadbottom Apiary will be providing local honey and beeswax block straight from the local hives.
- Down the road at 103 Mottram Road opposite the train station, Retold by Barbara Taylor-Jones, at her studio at Harewood Farm Cottage. Beautiful pieces of jewellery handmade using a carefully selected mixture of vintage, recycled and new materials.
- Further down the road outside the Community Centre you will find Cally Dean, with her Off The Wall Art and Pet Portraits by Cally
- And The Rhubarb Factory will be offering locally grown homemade jams and chutneys.
- Also outside the Centre will be 'Kikapu' with hampers, handmade crafts made by Kenyan Artisans, and a range of Christmas themed items, all one of a kind.
- Finally, down the road at 65 Lower Market St, outside their HQ (the old Cheshire cheese pub), Stop the Clock Design will be offering their distinctive, quirky cards, featuring bumper bargain packs of Christmas cards- 20 cards for just £5 (rrp £50!!!). Other cards, notebooks and prints will also be on offer.
- And while you're in the neighbourhood, you can also visit Lyme field Arts & Crafts Centre and Lyme field Garden Centre and food shop.

Some vendors require you to make an appointment to visit but either way it might be prudent to let people know you are definitely planning to visit their stall.

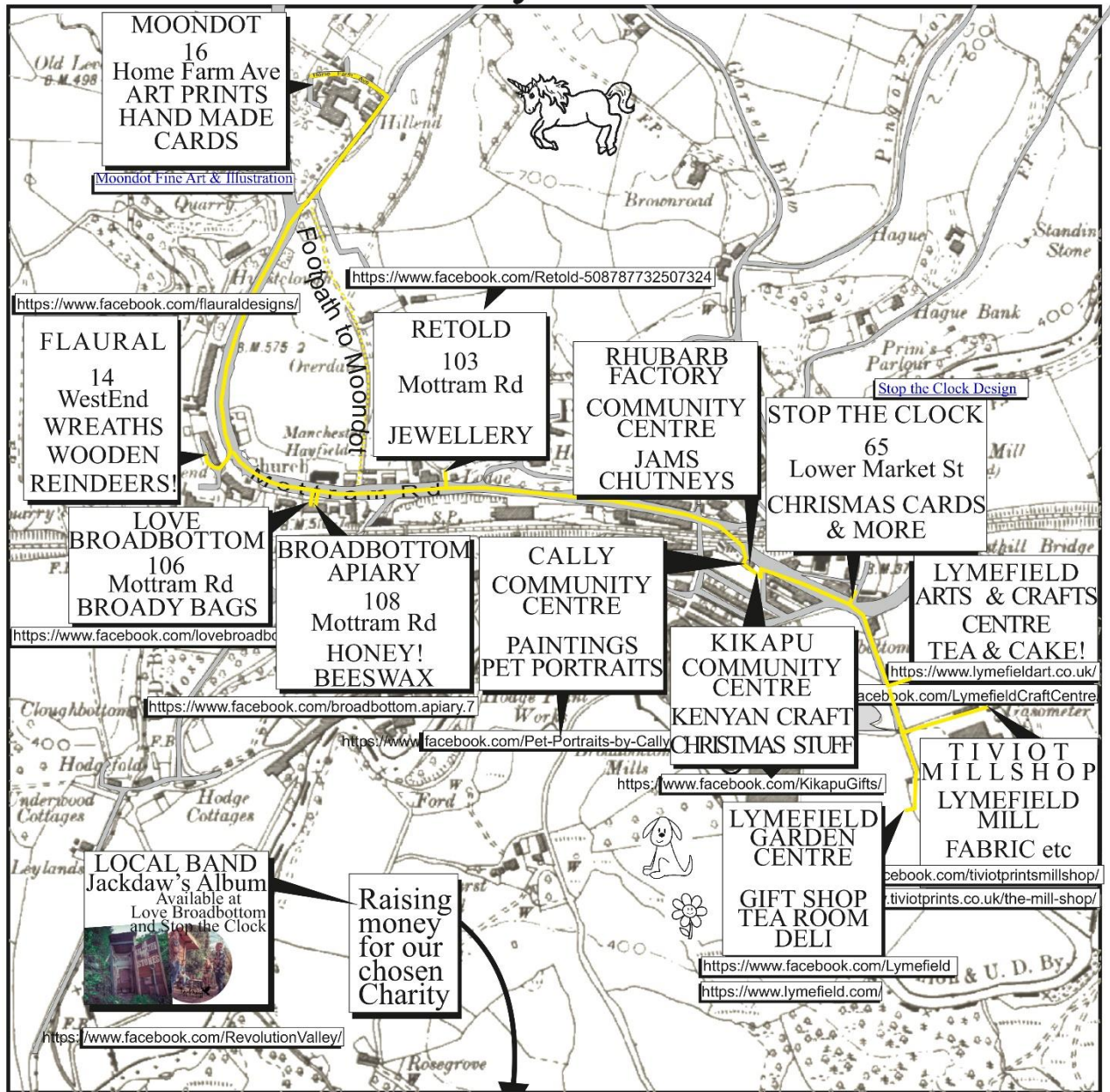
