Purple Class created 100 Acre Wood maps created after the Winnie the Pooh classic tale.



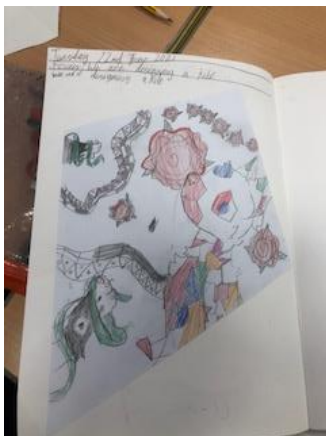
Green Class

Green Class took part in a Paddington Bear tasting test. They tasted marmalade and different options including strawberry jam, lemon curd and chocolate spread.



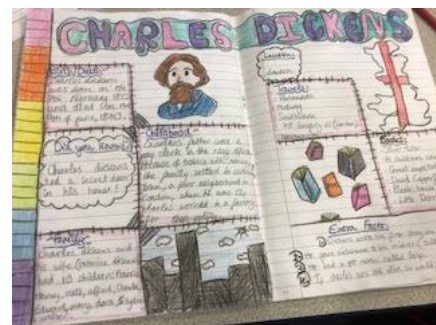
Red Class
