
Ruby's Worry by Tom Percival

Loved To Bits by Teresa Heapy



A fun rhyming story in which ten sausages meet various fates while trying to escape from the frying pan.



Nicola Colton**





Grandpa Bert and the Ghost Snatchers by Malorie Blackman



Laura Ella Anderson**




