FOUNDATIONS FOR MINISTRY

Is this for you?

In the past the diocese have run these courses nearer to the centre of the diocese but have realised that this has been a great disadvantage to those living further out, such

as those in Mottram and surrounding areas. They have decided to run a course here, but this can only run if they have enough of an uptake. So, please do contact Rev Cait if you are interested. These courses can take you on journeys with God that you may never have considered before and inspire lifelong friendships.



Who the course is for

Foundations is for lots of different lay people

People go on from Foundations for Ministry to support many different kinds of Christian ministry:

- Serving God at work or in the community;
- Roles within the church (children's work, pastoral work, etc.)
- Ordained ministry (Vicars, Chaplains etc);
- Licensed lay ministry (Readers, Pastoral Workers, Parish Nurse, Church Army and more).

The course is open to anyone who wants to grow and develop in Christian ministry. It is not a basics course, so it is expected that students will have some background in Christian life and thinking. Often it is useful for people to do Foundations for Ministry after another course of Christian learning (e.g. Pilgrim Course, Emmaus, Alpha, Adult Confirmation etc.)

Foundations for Ministry is about applying the Bible and Christian thinking to ministry in the church and the world – it is not a course mainly about how the Bible fits together, so it is expected that people have some of that material under their belts before they come on the course.

All applicants will already be actively involved as Christians in serving God through the church and in their lives.

Foundations is the required "first-step" course for those going on to Reader and Pastoral Worker training.

We ask that anyone thinking of applying discuss it with their incumbent minister and get their approval first.

How the course runs

There are 24 evening sessions, spread over 3 terms from September to May (8 evenings per module, 7.30pm-9.30pm - this year these will be offered online as well as face-to-face where regulations allow). There is an induction day at the start of the course in September, and 2 days on ministry which are on Saturdays (how these operate this year will be dependent on Covid regulations).

FOUNDATIONS FOR MINISTRY (continued)

The evening sessions are usually split into two:

Worship and a lively presentation from the front on the topic of the evening;

Small group time. This involves discussion, reflection, practical exercises, personal sharing and prayer. Students will be expected to take part in discussion and various exercises – come prepared to be involved and you will also be expected to do about an hour of linkwork between sessions, which feeds into the group discussion.

Pathways through the course

The course can be completed in one of three ways:

- By simply attending the sessions;
- By attendance plus written work; or
- By attendance plus assessed written work and registration for the University of Chester's CUC (Ministry) award.

Completion of the CUC Ministry is an essential requirement for those intending to become licensed Readers or Pastoral Workers.

What the assessed work involves

Most people choose to follow the assessed work pathway. There is a choice of different assignments, including reflections on what you are learning on the course, group based exercises, parish-based projects and more. There is a total of four pieces of written work to complete the assessed course. We offer study skills help for people who haven't done this sort of thing before, or haven't done it in a long while. Resources will be available via the Internet.

Internet access and basic competency in using Microsoft Office are needed to complete the course.

What do I get at the end of it?

Everybody who does the course gets a certificate of completion.

The assessed pathway is validated by the University of Chester. On successful completion of the course you will be awarded the Church Universities' Certificate in Ministry — a nationally recognized award — which allows you to take those credits on into further study.

How to apply

Application forms can be obtained from the Committee and Ministry (CfM) office at Church House. These need to be returned, with payment, by 31 August. Discuss the application with your incumbent, then contact the Course Administrator ministry@chester.anglican.org

The deadline for applications is 31 August, although all places may be filled well before then. We will always consider applications received after the deadline. If you are accepted by your parish and the Diocese to train as a Pastoral Worker or Reader, you will definitely be given a place on the course as it forms the first year of your training. Do note however, these ministries have a selection process in place.

News From Chester Diocese

Two new appointments will bring Chester diocese back to its full complement of bishops. The Ven. Julie Conalty and Canon Sam Corley will be consecrated as bishops of Birkenhead and Stockport respectively in July.

Revd Canon Sam Corley read theology at Durham and taught history in Surrey before training for the ministry at St John's College Nottingham.

In 2004 he was ordained in the Diocese of Blackburn, where he became a parish priest. Sam says he's comfortable in a wide range of worship contexts - including leading worship for 2000 scouts in a cowshed at the Great Yorkshire Showground.



The Bishop of Leeds, Nick Baines thanked Sam for ten years of energetic service in the region: "Sam has served the Diocese of Leeds and the wider Church of England with great diligence, wisdom, and generosity. He has inspired many people to greater vision and ministry within and beyond the Church. His appointment to the See of Stockport is wonderful for the Church, the wider community in the Diocese of Chester, and the bishops nationally. I am very sorry to be losing him but very confident that his ministry will continue to grow in the future."

Sam is married to Claire, who is herself in ordained ministry in the Church of England, and they have three children. Having spent much of his childhood working on a farm, Sam also has a deep love of the countryside and nature.

The **Venerable Julie Conalty** grew up NW England but has spent the last 35 years "exiled" in the south.

She experienced a call to ordained ministry as a teenager and on leaving school she moved to Sheffield to study for a Biblical Studies degree. Upon graduation, as women could not train to become priests, Julie found work running a homeless shelter, trained as a social worker and began a career in the Probation



Service. Eventually, she was accepted for ordination training and was ordained deacon in 1999 and priest in 2000. Her training parish was in Southwark Diocese where she was initially a self-supporting minister.

The Bishop of Rochester, James Langstaff welcomed news of Julie's appointment: "Archdeacon Julie has given a huge amount to our diocese in a relatively short space of time, serving first as vicar of Christ Church Erith and Area Dean of Erith. Her passion to see safeguarding taken seriously has changed not just processes, but also culture within the diocese. She would agree there is still a long way to go, but her contribution in this area has been of huge importance. We assure her of our prayers as she takes on this new ministry."

Julie is married to Simon and they have two grown-up sons. Julie likes a beer and a takeaway curry on a Friday night and the family support Charlton Athletic.

News From the C of E



A FLOCK of 18,000 paper doves have been strung together on fifteenand-a half miles of ribbon for an art installation in Liverpool Cathedral.

The work, Peace Doves by the sculptor Peter Walker, is illuminated by a light show and accompanied by a soundtrack, "Ruah Qadeska", composed by David Harper.

Many of the doves carry prayers and messages of peace written by thousands of schoolchildren and others. The artwork should have gone on display a year ago, but was delayed by the lockdown.

The Dean of Liverpool, the Very Revd Dr Sue Jones, said that she had been moved by reading prayers and messages on the doves, "from people paying tribute to those they have lost, to those wishing for better times and, of course, many wishing for peace".

She invited people to "come and stand, sit, or lie under the installation, and look up at the doves and experience a sense of serenity and peace".

The installation continues until 31 August.

More News From the C of E

The tightening of the Government's coronavirus restrictions on singing, only 24 hours after the relaxation of rules covering the entertainment industry, has caused bewilderment in church congregations.

Pubs, theatres and sports grounds were all allowed to open up last week but new guidance, applicable to England only, has restricted gatherings of amateur singers to just six.

The assistant director of music at Ely Cathedral, Glen Dempsey, posted on Twitter: "10,000 football fans singing in football stadiums, dozens singing in pubs, yet only six non-professionals are allowed to sing in our cavernous cathedrals, churches, theatres and concert halls."

The director of the Royal School of Church Music (RSCM), Hugh Morris, said this week that the restriction had created "upheaval, not to say uproar", and he urged all singers to show solidarity in song by joining the Big Music Sunday Service, online, on 6 June from Lichfield Cathedral.

He said that, as choirs were so severely restricted again, the service was "a powerful way for singers to come together, even if that has to be online. The music is rich and varied, and comes from around the world, which seems especially appropriate at this time, as we all come together to support each other."

The service will be streamed live at 6 p.m. on the day, on the RSCM's YouTube channel, and will be broadcast on the BBC's *Songs of Praise*. Resources are available through the RSCM website.

An online parliamentary petition can be signed at **petition.parliament.uk/petitions/586559**

asking the Government to allow choirs of any size to rehearse indoors, provided that social distancing is maintained and Covid-secure measures are in place.

The Dean of Lichfield, the Very Revd Adrian Dorber, who chairs the Association of English Cathedrals, said on Tuesday: "We appreciate public-health concerns, but now that sport stadiums, pubs and bars are open again, and more and more of us are vaccinated, it seems punitive of the authorities to stamp down on singing, especially on amateur choirs and church congregations.

"There is very little definite, published, and properly peer-reviewed evidence to support these draconian measures."

A huge number of amateur choirs in England - many thousands - are the church choirs of the various Christian denominations.


